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Introducing our new Executive Director, Amy Rauert




Norwich University in Northfield, VT until retirement.


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Slice zucchini and squash in a spiralizer to make the noodles. If you don't own one, use a knife or mandolin to create the julienneshape. Cut spiraled vegetable noodles into 4 to 6-inch pieces. In a large skillet or wok, heat olive oil over medium heat. Add onion, garlic, and ginger to oil and cook for about 3 minutes until onion softens. Add in shrimp, and cook until pink and opaque, about 5 minutes. Add in spiralized zucchini and squash to skillet, and cook for about 3 minutes to soften.

Add in sriracha sauce and stir to coat.
